

## Thursday, September 16, 2021 Kalahari Resorts & Conventions

The NEPA Alliance held a Board of Directors Meeting on Thursday, September 16, 2021, at Kalahari Resorts and Conventions Pocono Manor, PA. Board Chairperson Joe Sebelin called the meeting to order at 4:00pm.

Board Chairperson Joe Sebelin asked the Board of Directors to join him in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Jeff asked everyone to introduce themselves and their business affiliation. Jeff welcomed new Board members Dr. Katie Leonard, Mike Rollison and Chris Doherty.

#### **ACTION ITEMS**

<u>Minutes</u> - A motion was made by Michelle Mikitish and seconded by Mike Rollison to accept the minutes from the Board of Directors Meeting of June 30, 2021, as presented. **Motion carried** 

<u>Treasurers Report</u> – Wendi reported that on the Statement of Activities as of July 31, 2021, NEPA has total revenues and total expenses of approximately \$240,000. She noted that there is an increase in net assets of \$175. Wendi further noted that NEPA is only one (1) month into the new fiscal year, but is off to a good start. She stated that NEPA has a healthy cash balance of approximately \$800,000.

A motion was made by Comm. Joe Adams and seconded by Cynthia DeFebo to accept the Treasurer Report as presented. **Motion carried** 

#### **President & CEO Report**

Jeff reported that the 2021 Annual Report will be available at the Networking Reception detailing the program metrics on how well the staff performed over the past year. He noted that many of NEPA's core programs have seen an increase in performance. He encouraged everyone to take a report.

Jeff stated that the economic development partners from around the region are looking to secure a Build Back Better grant from the Economic Development Administration (EDA) to start an initiative to support the aerospace advance manufacturing sector in northeast Pennsylvania. He noted that three (3) committees have been created (entrepreneurship, workforce and innovative agriculture).

Jeff reported that Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC) has a lot of money for projects. He noted that area development, POWER and INSPIRE are seeing an increase in funds. Jeff further reported that Carbon County is receiving a \$50,000 ARC grant for a broadband study and the Outreach Center in Scranton received \$175,000 ARC grant.

Jeff reported that NEPA is anticipating passing of the bipartisan infrastructure bill by the end of the month, which will result in additional dollars for the Commonwealth for transportation projects.

There being no further business Board Chairman Joe Sebelin adjourned the meeting at 4:23pm. He noted that the next meeting will be November 3, 2021.

Dear Board Members,

We are closing in on the completion of another calendar year and we have completed the first quarter of the NEPA Fiscal Year. We are very busy looking at new programming and demonstrating solid results in our existing programs. Here is a small sample of the numerous programs we are working on.

<u>NEPA Launch – Regional Aerospace Alliance</u> - The Economic Development Administration (EDA) announced a few months ago that they would have \$3 billion dollars for economic development. The largest program is Build Back Better Regional Challenge. This program will offer an initial \$500,000 grant to plan for the second phase. There will be only 50 - 60 initial grants and 30 +/- phase 2 grants in the range of \$25 - \$75 million per region.

We have brought together numerous partners within our region to support a regional application to enhance the aerospace supply chain in Northeast Pennsylvania. We have partnered with the Scranton Chamber and Northeastern Pennsylvania Industrial Resource Center (NEPIRC) to pay for a consultant to craft the initial application. NEPA, the Scranton Chamber and Northeastern Pennsylvania Industrial Resource Center will be the lead agencies on the project, but all partners in the region are included. If approved, the project will work with all aerospace, advanced manufacturing companies in the region to help them expand their aerospace and space businesses.

ARC Federal Co-Chair Visit -The new ARC Federal Co-Chair, Gayle Manchin will be visiting Northeast Pennsylvania on November 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup>. She was invited by Congressman Matt Cartwright to tour ARC projects in our region. We are actively engaged in planning the visit along with our partners, the State ARC Office, and Congressman Cartwright's office. We will share more details when the itinerary is finalized.

<u>Pittston Chamber Presentation</u> - We will be presenting at the Pittston Chamber fall breakfast meeting in November. Thanks to Michelle Mikitish for inviting NEPA to present!

<u>Staffing Issues</u> - We are in the hiring mode at NEPA. We have hired a new accountant to replace a retiring employee. The new individual will start in early November.

We continue to review applicants for a Community and Economic Development Manager. This is another replacement for a position vacated a few months ago. If we receive funding from the several grant applications, we have submitted we will have funding for additional positions.

<u>Website Re-Build</u> - We are working with our website consultant to reconstruct our website. We hope to complete that process this fall.

#### **ENGAGE!**

On behalf of the Northeast Pennsylvania Partnerships for Regional Economic Performance (PREP) partners, NEPA annually applies for the *Engage!* initiative. *Engage!* is a Pennsylvania statewide business retention and expansion (BRE) program designed to interact with targeted companies regularly and proactively. The overall goal of *Engage!* is to retain existing businesses and to help them grow and expand by building solid relationships with business owners or key decision makers and economic development partners. NEPA received \$180,900 for *Engage!* for FY 21-22 and we will be subcontracting with 13 partners to complete the project deliverables.

In response to the COVID-19 Pandemic, NEPA is offering, through the "Get Connected" initiative, e-commerce technical assistance to businesses. NEPA has contracted with three web development/tech firms to assist the launch of this initiative, which offers a free suite of services to develop an online sales platform that will assist in stabilizing the business and generate new sales and clients during the pandemic. Thus far NEPA has assisted over 50 businesses. Phase III business recipients are listed below. Each client received \$3,500 is consulting support for their business and e-commerce platform.

#### **NEPA Community Impact Fund**


NEPA's new affiliate organization, the NEPA Community Impact Fund, was formally certified a Community Development Entity (CDE) and is actively seeking an allocation of New Markets Tax Credits (NMTC) from the U.S. Department of the Treasury. NEPA is actively seeking tax credits on behalf of three clients. We were unsuccessful in securing a NMTC allocation from the 2020 and 2021 rounds. NEPA is soliciting projects from the Commonwealth of PA with capital costs ranging from \$5M-\$60M that need NTMC subsidies to make the project viable.

#### StartUp NEPA

NEPA has raised \$500,000 in support of our Angel Fund initiative. We continue to meet with potential investors and expect to be at \$600,000 by December 2021. Official Launch will occur in 2022.

#### Capital Financing Services Pennsylvania Redevelopment Assistance Capital Program (RACP)

NEPA has partnered with CBO Financial, our NMTC consultant, to offer RACP grant writing assistance and Financial Request Package support for the clients in the table below.

#### NORTHEASTERN PENNSYLVANIA NONPROFIT & COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE CENTER

**NEPA Grantmakers Forum:** In collaboration with the Harry & Jeannette Weinberg Foundation, the McGowan Charitable Trust, The Luzerne Foundation, the Scranton Area Community Foundation, and the Margaret Briggs Foundation, NCAC launched the NEPA Grantmakers initiative. NCAC is planning a Fall Leadership meeting and a Winter Forum.

#### BLUE RIBBON TASK FORCE (BRTF) / TOBYHANNA ARMY DEPOT

NEPA manages the Blue Ribbon Task Force (BRTF), which was organized in 1992 to provide regional community support for the preservation and protection of Tobyhanna Army Depot from the base closure process known as Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC).

The NEPA Alliance received several grants from the Pennsylvania Military Community Enhancement Commission to support the Depot. The funding was used to develop a SWOT Analysis of the TYAD as compared to other installations. NEPA is currently working with a consultant, Edwards+Strunk, Inc., a consulting firm based in Madison Township, Lackawanna County, to develop and implement a fundraising plan.



NEPA annually prepares an Economic Impact Analysis of the Depot. In the last update, which is for FY 2020, it was established that the total impact of the Depot is an estimated \$2.9 billion in economic activity, an estimated 10,168 jobs, and an estimated \$729.8 million in labor income within an eleven (11) county region in Northeast Pennsylvania.

**Featured Article:** This month's article presents the not seasonally adjusted unemployment rates for the nation, state, region, and each of the seven counties within the NEPA Alliance service area.


#### **Not Seasonally Adjusted Unemployment Rates**


According to the first chart, the not seasonally adjusted unemployment rates, as provided by the PA WorkStats Program of the Center for Workforce Information & Analysis at the PA Department of Labor & Industry, indicate that the average regional unemployment rate was 9.5 percent from September 2019 to August 2020 and 7.8 percent from September 2020 to August 2021. The average national unemployment rate from September 2019 to August 2020 was 6.9 percent and 6.2 percent from September 2020 to August 2021. The average state unemployment rate from September 2019 to August 2020 was 8.3 percent and 6.8 percent from September 2020 to August 2021.

According to the second chart, the difference in the monthly not seasonally adjusted unemployment rates between the region and nation was 1.8 percentage points in September 2019 before fluctuating to its maximum of 4.3 percentage points in July 2020. It then decreased to its minimum of -0.1 percentage points in September 2020 before fluctuating to 2.5 percentage points in August 2021. During the 24- month period, the average not seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 6.6 percent in the nation and 8.7 percent in the region.

In September, October and November 2019, the difference in the monthly not seasonally adjusted unemployment rates between the region and state was 0.9 percentage points before fluctuating to its maximum of 2.2 percentage points in April and May 2020. It then decreased to its minimum of 0.1 percentage points in October 2020 before fluctuating to 1.1 percentage points in August 2021. During the 24-month period, the average not seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Pennsylvania was 7.5 percent.









#### LDD CUSTOMER SATISFACTION SURVEY FORMS

Thirty one (31) out of thirty-two (32) LDD Customer Satisfaction Survey forms were completed by NEPA clients who received assistance through NEPA's Business Financing, Procurement Technical Assistance Center and International Business Programs for assistance received during the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2021-2022 which represented an 97% response rate. Thirty-one (31) clients indicated they were very satisfied/satisfied with the assistance they received through NEPA. This gives an overall satisfaction rate of 100% from surveys received for the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2021-2022.

#### **International Business Development Program**

The International Business Development staff recorded fifty-four (54) Export Actions and generated twenty-four (24) International Projects to Pennsylvania's Authorized Trade Representatives from July 1 – September 30, 2021. Staff processed five (5) Global Access Program (GAP) applications and two (2) GAP reimbursements during this timeframe. GAP is an export promotion grant administered by the Pennsylvania Office of International Business Development (OIBD) under a State Trade Expansion Program (STEP) award from the U.S. Small Business Administration.

NEPA partnered with the Pennsylvania Department of Community & Economic Development, Office of International Business Development to promote Bringing the World to PA 2021. This year Bringing the World to PA was held virtually as a series of seventeen (17) webinars that took place September 13 - 24, 2021. Webinars were presented by the Pennsylvania Authorized Trade Representatives and by local, state, and federal trade assistance partners.

#### TRANSPORTATION PLANNING SERVICES DIVISION

#### **Federal Transportation Funding**

- The federal transportation authorization was set to expire on September 30<sup>th</sup>. A short-term extension was passed at the end of September to extend transportation funding. The House and Senate are continuing to consider transportation reauthorization legislation to extend and expand transportation programs and funding for the next 5 years as well as funding other transportation and infrastructure needs.
- Several member-designated projects were included in the House-passed transportation legislation. NEPA sent letters to Senator Casey and Senator Toomey urging their support for the projects in the final version of the bill.

#### 2023 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Development

- The 2023 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) development has begun. The State Transportation Commission held a public comment period on transportation issues as part of the development of the Statewide Twelve Year Program. In addition, the Financial Guidance and General and Procedural Guidance Work Groups developed guidance for the development of the TIP by each Planning Partner.
- The funding formulas were shared with the Planning Partners this past summer. The funding shifts to the Interstate Highway System are fully implemented during the 2023 TIP, resulting in lower funding for the regional TIP projects.
- Initial meetings with PennDOT Districts and county planners occurred in early October. The meetings included a review of the status of current projects and a discussion of which projects will carry over into the next TIP. Without additional state or federal funding, very few new projects will be added to the 2023 TIP. In September, PennDOT Central Office asked each Planning Partner to identify their top priority projects to be advanced or expanded in the event that additional funding is provided.

#### 2022-2024 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) Development

- Guidance for the development of the 2022-2024 UPWP was provided to the MPOs/RPOs earlier this summer. Requirements are similar to the previous work program. Development of the new work program began with a kickoff meeting of the NEPA MPO UPWP work group on August 17<sup>th</sup> at which the current work program and the status of priority tasks were reviewed. A second meeting of the UPWP Work Group was held on September 21<sup>st</sup> to discuss priorities for the next two years.
- A draft of the UPWP has been shared with the Technical Committee for their review. The draft will be submitted to FHWA and PennDOT at the beginning of November for a 45-day review. Final adoption of the UPWP must occur by the end of January 2022.

#### **Request for Qualifications for Consulting Services**

• NEPA staff has developed a Request for Qualification (RFQ) for a consultant for the update of the Long Range Transportation Plan for the NEPA MPO. The RFQ is also a solicitation for an



open end agreement for a consultant to assist in the update/development of other planning initiatives as deemed necessary.

• The NEPA MPO Technical Committee reviewed the RFQ at the September 21<sup>st</sup> meeting and the RFQ was advertised on Thursday, September 23<sup>rd</sup>, with a deadline of October 22<sup>nd</sup>. Two proposals were received. Each consultant will present at the November 16<sup>th</sup> Technical Committee Meeting and a consultant will be selected by the end of December.

#### **Eastern PA Regional Freight Study**

- The development of a regional freight study has been identified as a task in the current UPWP. Given the regional nature of freight movements, particularly due to the warehousing and distribution growth in the adjoining Lehigh Valley and Scranton/Wilkes-Barre MPOs, staff has been in discussions with neighboring Planning Partners about developing a collaborative regional freight plan.
- Five MPOs have agreed to conduct a joint freight plan as the Eastern Pennsylvania Freight Alliance NEPA MPO, Lehigh Valley MPO, Lackawanna-Luzerne MPO, Reading MPO and Lebanon MPO. The group has developed a framework and submitted an application to Central Office for supplemental planning funds for the initiative.
- The project was awarded \$280,000 in supplemental planning funds to be leveraged by a \$70,000 match provided by the participating MPOs. The Lehigh Valley Planning Commission has agreed to serve as the fiscal agent for this project. The development of the plan is expected to occur over a 24 month period. In the coming weeks, the freight alliance will execute an agreement between the five MPOs and solicit proposals from qualified freight plan consultants.

#### **Functional Classification Review**

• The functional classification review is complete and was submitted to Central Office in early February. The submission package included 84 changes, with the required mapping and spreadsheets. Concurrence letters from the PennDOT districts and neighboring planning partners were also submitted to Central Office. Central Office has reviewed the proposed changes and has requested additional information on several changes. Staff is working with the counties to provide the additional information and will resubmit the package to Central Office in the coming weeks.

#### Milford Borough Traffic Study

• Milford Borough Traffic Study was kicked off in January 2020. The steering committee requested that the study be delayed due to COVID-19 travel restrictions and its profound impact upon normal travel patterns. The steering committee has recently indicated that they would like to move ahead with the study this year. Staff has re-engaged Michael Baker International, the consultant on the study. A meeting with the steering committee was held on August 17<sup>th</sup> to review the traffic data collected during Music Fest in July and discuss further community engagement. Completion of the study is expected by next June.

#### Rt. 61 Reconstruction Project INFRA Grant Application

• PennDOT applied for funding for the Rt. 61 Reconstruction Project through the U.S. DOT's Infrastructure For Rebuilding America (INFRA) program. PennDOT submitted an application in 2020, but it was not awarded funding. A revised application was submitted in March of this year.



An announcement about INFRA grants awards was released in June and we learned that the Rt. 61 Revitalization Project received \$21 million in competitive federal INFRA grant.

#### **Highway Performance Monitoring System (HPMS)**

- NEPA is responsible for the collection of data for the Highway Performance Monitoring System (HPMS). The HPMS is a national level highway information system that includes data on the extent, condition, performance, use and operating characteristics of the nation's highways. MPOs are required to update and confirm data included in the HPMS on an annual basis. The collection involves field work at over 90 locations within the NEPA MPO region identified by PennDOT Central Office.
- Staff attended an online HPMS workshop conducted by Central Office on July 27-28. Staff also participated in a quality assurance field view with Central Office staff on August 25<sup>th</sup> to review the data collected over the past two years. Data collection efforts for this year are underway and must be completed by the beginning of December.

#### **Geographic Information Systems (GIS)**

- GIS staff is continuing to complete mapping activities for the transportation program. Staff has created a HUB site for transportation programshttps://nepa-gis-nepa-alliance.hub.arcgis.com/pages/transportation

#### **Local Technical Assistance Program (LTAP)**

• NEPA has partnered with PennDOT to deliver the LTAP training series in the Lackawanna-Luzerne Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) region, the NEPA MPO region and Wayne County. LTAP resumed in-person classes this fall. 8 in-person classes are scheduled in the NEPA region for Fall 2021. LTAP will also continue to offer courses in an online format.


